Offering an elegant environment with a casual atmosphere, The Press Club is the newest addition to the S.E. Clinton Corner Neighborhood. Open from 10am to 10pm during the week and 10am to midnight on weekends, The Press Club presents fine wine, international beer, Stumptown coffee, desserts by Joseph's Bakery, bread and pastries from Pearl Bakery, homemade crepes and gourmet sandwiches as well as S.E. Portland's largest independent retail magazine selection.

The environment is a spacious, modern loft space with cathedral-height, unfinished ceilings and natural light provided by rooftop windows and ten-foot high, glass framed front doors. The walls are adorned with work by local artists, updated monthly (currently Bromoil printed photographs by Terry Halstead).

The Press Club is brought to you by Pete Strolis and Kevin Friedman, two longtime Portlanders who have been involved with many aspects of the city's community. Pete helped open and manage a number of Portland's favorite establishments: The 1201, The Bar of the Gods, The Shanghai Tunnel, Bossa Nova, Genie's and Tiny's Coffee. Kevin has been in Portland's music and writing community for over a decade with projects such as Lee Baby Simms, The Escapists, Imogene, The Makeout Scene, and Torcher and he has held positions of Music Director at KPSU Radio and as Label Manager at Tim/Kerr Records, Editor of The Portland Review Literary Journal and PDX Magazine and has written for Filter Magazine, The Oregonian, The Portland Tribune, The Rocket, Just Out, Anodyne, the Portland Beavers and others.

"We wanted to make a place that would be great to come to in the day for lunch or coffee, but that would also be perfect at night for a date, or even by yourself," say the owners. "That's one of the reasons we sell magazines, so our customer have something to do if they choose to come in alone."

After a furious month of knocking down walls, construction and painting, The Press Club is now open and announces its grand opening celebration, Friday, June 30 from 8pm-midnight.
